





Types of Academic Dishonesty

98% of reported cases involve cheating or plagiarism

Cheating

 Giving or receiving of unauthorized assistance or unfair advantage on any form of academic work

Plagiarism

- The use of someone else's words, ideas, opinions, graphs, etc. presented as your own without citation
- Deliberate, unintentional, self-plagiarism

Falsification





Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act (FERPA)

- FERPA gives you the right to access your academic record <u>and</u> requires your permission before the university can release it to anyone else.
- Students are required to present their Hokie Passport or have a FERPA passcode to discuss academic and financial records.
- Students can create a FERPA passcode in HokieSpa.

Student Medical Insurance

Am I required to have health insurance?

The following populations must maintain health insurance that complies with VT's requirements:

- International students on F-1 and J-1 visas
- Vet Med students
- VTCSOM students

Virginia Tech recommends, but does not require, other students outside these categories to carry health insurance.

Healthcare and Health Insurance are complicated and expensive.

If you explore alternatives to Virginia Tech's plan, keep in mind:

- Any alternative plan must meet <u>all</u> of VT's requirements.
- A waiver must be submitted with details of the plan to demonstrate compliance.
- Understand what you are buying <u>before</u> making a payment.

Important – If you are a mandatory student and you do not enroll in the Aetna plan or have an approved waiver by the deadline, you will automatically be enrolled in the Aetna Student Health Insurance and a charge will be sent to your student account.

MEDICAL COVERAGE

- Spring Plan: January 1st July 31st
- Schiffert services covered at 100%
- Deductible \$450
- Generic script copay \$15 or less
- Chiropractic coverage
- Mental health coverage
- Maternity benefits
- Allergy testing & treatment coverage

VISION COVERAGE

- \$15 copay then the plan pays 100% for eye exam
- Can be reimbursed up to \$120 for eyeglasses or contacts
 - Requires claim form submission

DENTAL COVERAGE

- OPTIONAL COVERAGE, available to all students and dependents enrolled in the Medical Plan.
- Preventative services covered at 100%.
- \$444.00 cost per participant

COST & ENROLLMENT



VT Aetna Student Plan Costs

- Spring premium: \$2,191.50
- Optional Dental:
 \$444.00 (paid directly to Aetna when enrolling)

What if I have an assistantship?

VT covers 88% (calculated annually) of the student premium for graduate students with qualifying assistantships.

Students are <u>NOT</u> automatically enrolled in the plan; you must sign up.

ASSISTANTSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Must be at least a 10 hour per week assistantship.
- Student must enroll in the VT plan (you will need to mark that you will have an active assistantship on the enrollment form).

Graduate Student Health Insurance Premium are sent to your student account through the Bursar's Office

These are the items from Virginia Tech that are checked out to you. As an off-campus student, always use ILLiad for all of your requests. You may have books checked out to you here as well as on your ILLiad account.



Interlibrary Loan (ILLiad)

See the interlibrary loan guide for additional details about the service https://guides.lib.vt.edu/ill

ILLiad is an online form for **requesting items not available full text in library resources.** This includes books and articles available in our physical collections as well as **interlibrary loan** materials from other lending libraries.

Extended users (those outside of Montgomery, Pulaski, and Giles counties) should register to receive books via UPS and then return them using the U.S. Postal Service pre-paid postage label included with the item.

Most article and book chapter requests will be completed with a PDF in your ILLiad account under "View PDF Articles".

Update your address in <u>"Change Account Information</u>" as needed. Packages go to the address on file in this system at the time of the request.

Off-campus students, you should always use ILLiad for all of your requests.

Research Guides including database and resource recommendations

Resources are organized by academic areas. The page includes subject librarian contact information along with suggested online database resources and links for getting started in your research. The Databases track the many publications, data sets, statistics, and multimedia you may use for your research or assignments. We currently have 800+ databases, so we use Subject Guides <u>https://guides.lib.vt.edu/subject-guides</u> for current resources and recommendations.



Advanced Search – Discovery Search

This tool allows searching over most library resources in most formats – including books (physical and ebooks), articles, video recordings, streaming videos, conference proceedings, and more!

If there are a lot of results, you can use the "Tweak your results" section and choose "Available online" under Availability or "Articles" under Format for example.


Vague or short searches will give too many results.

Well developed searches using **Subject** and phrases within quotes will result in fewer results.

Example: Searching <u>"supply chain</u>" the phrase using the quotation marks gives results containing the two-word phrase and fewer results than <u>supply chain</u> when the two words are simply in the document but not necessarily together.
